Your Investment: Summer Camp Impact

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS AND OUTCOMES

- 3,000 homemade fresh and healthy meals prepared by Rainey's Culinary Interns and Chef.
- 80% of total costs per participant were subsidized through donations and grants.
- 94% of students reported making new friends at camp.
- 90% of students want to return to Rainey Camp next summer.
- 88% of students reported that they learned to do something they've never done before.
- 88% of parents reported activities engaged their child & they learned new skills.
- 79% of students like making art more than they did at the beginning of camp.
- 79% of parents said that the camp tuition of \$300 was affordable for their families.
- 70% of students want to take more art, music, dance, or drama classes as a result of camp.

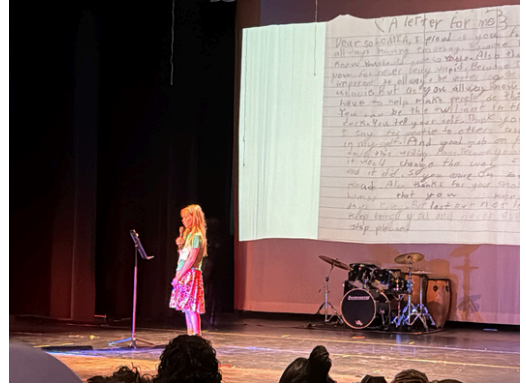
